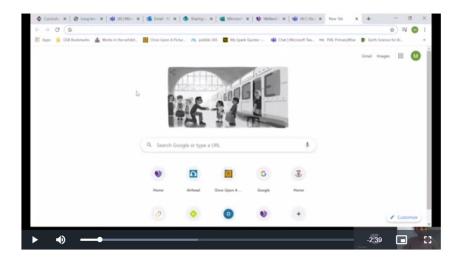

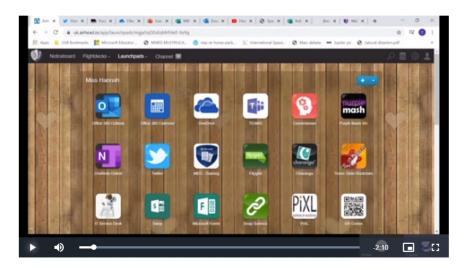

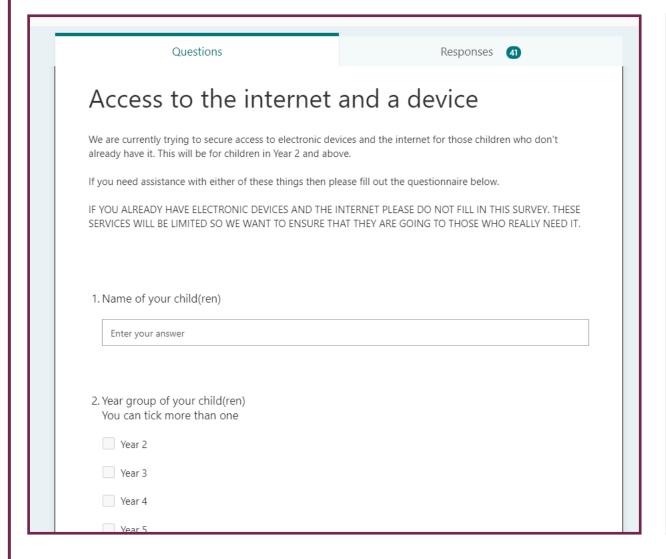

DEVICES





We sent out an MS Forms asking parents if they had access to the internet and electronic devices to complete the Home Learning.

Between the results from the MS Form and phone calls to all of the parents we completed a list of who needed what.

For parents with limited data allowance, we applied for unlimited data.

For parents with no internet connection we applied for dongles but sent paper-packs home in the meantime.

For parents without laptops we applied for device (we have so far been sent 18 laptops)



DEVICES



We sent out an MS Forms asking parents what they needed in terms of support for IT.

We requested laptops from the DfE;

Get laptops and tablets for children who cannot attend school due to coronavirus (COVID-19)

How schools, colleges, academy trusts and local authorities can access digital devices for children who are learning remotely.

We have requested wireless dongles to help our parents:

Can I request a wireless dongle for a year 4 student at Hazel Leys Academy.

They currently have unreliable access to a parents mobile phone only which is causing issues accessing remote learning.

We keep a communication log, stated what dates we made contact with parents, what the type of contact was, who made it and any relevant information from the discussion.

Children that are not attending the provision are called weekly. On top of this, emails are sent almost daily (whole school emails are not recorded on the log but are kept on the Groupcall website). Staff send out a weekly email to all the children in their class.

Head of School sends out some sort of weekly communication, whether it be with the parents or children.

Teachers and TAs are available all day on TEAMs, making contact with the children throughout the day and are there to answer questions regarding the work.

The Leadership team, pastoral team and office team take and make phone calls/emails constantly throughout the day.

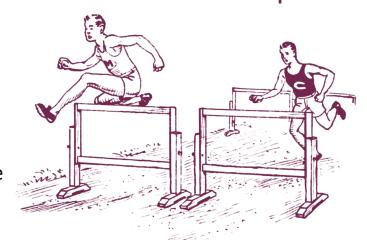
BARRIERS TO REMOTE LEARNING

'Sometimes we struggle to get on Tapestry, due to high demand'.

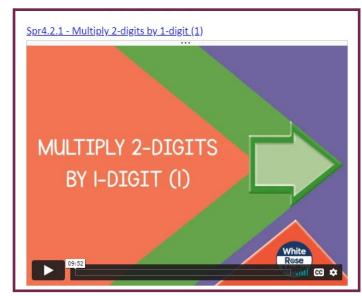

14.5 % of the children in school with SEND are attending our in-school provision.

- 61% of SEND children are currently using Remote Learning.
- Work is differentiated so that it is at an appropriate level for all children
- Regular contact is made
- Support videos have been sent out and further guidance have been sent to individual parents, depending on the need of their chid.



DAILY LEARNING TIME



We expect that remote education (including remote teaching and independent work) will take pupils broadly the following number of hours each day:

- 3 hours a day for Key Stage 1 (years 1 and 2 when pupils are aged between 5 and 7)
 - -There is approximately 1 hour of English
 - -There is approximately 1 hour of Maths
 - -There is approximately 30 minutes of Reading
 - There is approximately 30 minutes of Topic
 - There is then optional extra for children to complete using our different website subscriptions
- 4 hours a day for KS2 (years 3-6 when children are aged between 7 and 11
 - -There is approximately 1 hour of English
 - -There is approximately 1 hour of Maths
 - -There is approximately 30 minutes of Reading
 - There is approximately 1 hour of Topic
 - 30 minutes of Bug Club, Purple Mash or Times Tables Rockstars
