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Year 3 Newsletter – Spring 2

Welcome

We hope that you have all had an enjoyable and restful half term break. Hopefully, the last of the really cold weather is nearly behind us and we can start to look forward to the Spring!

In Year 3 this term, our topic is 'The Stone Age to Iron Age'. We have lots of interesting things planned, including a trip to Flag Fen in Peterborough which is the perfect place to experience this period in History, first hand. Spelling and Reading

This term we will continue to test spellings on a Friday and new spellings will be sent home on a Tuesday. We will also be continuing to hear the children read on their specified reading days. However, please ensure that reading books are always kept in book bags in case we need them at other times. As a reminder, children are expected to log on to Spelling Shed to practise their weekly spellings and books, which match children's reading levels, are on Ebooks.

Writing

In English we are going to be writing a letter, a portal narrative (story where a door goes into another world/time) and a character profile. These will all be based around the text 'Stone Age Boy'. We will also be doing some performance poetry based on poems about the Stone Age.



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Maths

In maths this term we are going to be working on length and perimeter, fractions and mass and capacity. It is important that children are secure in their 2,5- and 10-times tables and are focusing on their 3, 4 and 8s. Children are expected to practice weekly on TimesTable Rockstar to help with this. We have a weekly table bingo slot so that the children are visually seeing all the tables regularly.

Science

We are continuing our topic this term on The Power of Forces. In this term we will explore how magnets are a force by investigating magnetic poles, how magnetic poles attract or repel and understand the science behind gravity.

Computing

In computing we will be learning how to Code. We will learn about algorithms, collision detection, timers and repeat.




Design Technology

In D.T. this term our unit is 'Digital World: Electronic Charm'. We will be using technology to Program an eCharm and create a pouch to make it appealing to potential users.



History

Our history this term is 'Stone Age to Iron Age'. We will be exploring the following enquiry questions:



What was Britain like after the last Ice Age?

What was new about the 'New Stone Age'?

How did the Iron Age differ from the Bronze Age?

What do Celtic art forms tell us about how they saw their world?



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Music

The focus of our lessons is The Dragon Song in which we explore the themes of friendship and kindness in Folk Songs from around the world.



We will listen and appraise, take part in a range of musical activities and perform the songs.

Our topic for this term is Being Healthy. We will learn how to keep safe, how to keep our bodies healthy and find out what we know about drugs.
