

Year 5 Newsletter – Spring 2

Welcome

Welcome back, we hope you have had a lovely break. This term we have lots of exciting learning to complete. Our main topic for the term is UK countries, counties and land use. As with last term, our homework will be handed out on a Thursday to be handed in the following Tuesday. As a reminder, children can change their reading book on any day. Reading records will be collected in each Friday and Dojo points will be given out for the number of times children have read to an adult.

Spelling and Reading

This term we will continue to test spelling on a Tuesday and new spellings will be sent home on this day. In reading we are continuing to work on our inference and explanation skills as well as retrieval. As a reminder, children are expected to log on to Spelling Shed to practise their weekly spellings and books, which match children's reading levels, are on Ebooks. Dojo points are given for children using both these platforms weekly.



Writing

In English this term we will be writing letters of complaint, non-chronological reports linked to our geography topic about the human and physical features of the UK and playscripts. We will be continuing to develop our vocabulary as well as adding parenthesis to our writing. We will also be working on including more complex sentence types in our writing, including relative clauses and starting our sentences in different ways.



Maths

In maths we will continue to work on fractions. We will be adding, subtracting and multiplying fractions as well as finding fractions of amounts. We will then move on to changing fractions into decimals and looking at the relationships between fractions, decimals and percentages.



Science

Our science topic this term is reproduction in plants and animals. We will learn about the different parts of plants and flowers and how different plants reproduce in different ways. We will then compare how mammals, amphibians, insects and birds reproduce.



Computing

In computing we will be learning about coding. We will learn how to create effective codes, use if/else functions, repeat functions and number variables.




Art & Design

Geography

Our geography topic this term is UK countries, counties and land use. In this topic we will look at the countries that make up the UK and the counties of England. We will use maps and photographs to investigate the human and physical features of the UK and look at different land uses. Finally, we will compare farming in two different regions.

In music we will be learning about old school hip-hop. We will learn to perform, The Fresh Prince of Bel-Air.
