Summer 1 focus

This term the children will be learning about dinosaurs; creatures that were alive a very, very, long time ago. The children will be looking at both nonfiction and fiction books. The children will also be exploring rocks and fossils and what it was like many years ago to be a palaeontologist.



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
Phonics

At Hazel Leys, we use the Little Wandle Letters and Sounds Revised scheme. In Nursery, your Phonics child will take part in daily phonics sessions which will encourage them to listen to sounds in words, such as the sound that their name starts with. This term we will focus on the v, w, x y, z , qu , ch.

Our new children that are joined us will still be looking at, S, a, t,p,i,n and playing listening attention games.

We will also be looking at mark making in relation to stories we are learning about in class. We will also be focusing on name writing for those children going up to reception and pencil grip for the children staying with us.

<u>Literacy - Reading</u>

We will be sharing lots of lovely stories with your child in Early Years and we will upload stories to Tapestry for you to share at home.



Every Friday, your child will choose a 'Reading for Pleasure' book to take home. This is a book to be shared with the adults at home. By reading a wide range of books, your child will be emersed in storytelling and will expand their vocabulary.

We have now added reading groups every Friday this is when the children can pick a book in key worker groups and have a discussion on the book to help children with their listening but to also develop their vocabulary.

Maths

We LOVE to count in Early Years, we count everything and sing lots of number rhymes to help us remember the order of numbers when rote counting. This term we will be focusing on accurate number recognition and looking at number lines and ordering numbers from 0-10. We will also be looking at subitising and patterns.



Children who have just joined us will be looking at numbers 0-5 and counting objects.

Communication and Language

This term we will continue to retell stories in a variety of ways, ensuring that the children take on different roles. Children will be taught subject specific vocabulary so that they can use it accurately when talking about castles.



We will also continue sending a nursery rhyme home every Friday for you to practice with your child at home.

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Personal, Social and Emotional Development

This term we will be looking into healthy eating. We will be looking at how to keep ourselves healthy and what types of food are unhealthy. This will also link into exercise and why it is important we should exercise when we are at school.



Physical Development

In Nursery, we will be practising ways to move, encouraging fine motor activities, such as using scissors, pencils, and cutlery, encouraging good posture when sitting at the table or on the floor and practicing ball skills. We also have dough disco every morning to strengthen our fine motor skills.



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Our <u>PE lessons</u> will be on <u>Tuesday.</u> Now the weather is getting warmer we will also have opportunities to have our PE sessions on the track.

Children are to come to nursery in clothes that allow them to move easily so they can take part in our PE sessions. E.G leggings/tracksuit and t-shirt.

Understanding the World

This term we will be learning about dinosaurs. The children will learn about two specifics dinosaurs: Tyrannosaurus Rex and the Stegosaurus. We will be looking at comparing on how they walk? what they look like? and what they ate?



Expressive Arts and Design

We will be making lots of artwork that link to our topic this term such as designing our very own dinosaur and giving the dinosaur a unique name. using different materials such as paper plates to design a dinosaur. We will be designing dinosaur eggs and our own fossils using powder paints and felt tip pens.



Helping your child learn at home

- Share the 'Reading for Pleasure' book with your child.
- Encourage your child to put on their coats independently.
- Practice counting objects at home.









Skills Builder

The Skills Builder Universal Framework provides a common language for building essential skills with children and young people.

Research shows that building essential skills supports social and emotional wellbeing, learning and academic outcomes and careers and opportunities.

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Rewards

The children will receive 'Dojo Points' as reward for good behaviour, work and attitude. Points can be 'spent' on prizes periodically.



We will also be introducing a star of the week just in nursery class for your child to share at home with you.
