



KEY VOCABULARY

space	the <b>distance</b> within, around and between things in art
dimension	a <b>measurement</b>
height	the measurement of something from <b>top to bottom</b> : this is one of the dimensions
width	the measurement of something from <b>side to side</b> : this is one of the dimensions
depth	the measurement of something from <b>front to back</b> : this is one of the dimensions
3d	something 3d (3 dimensional) has height, width and depth – the <b>three dimensions</b> : you can touch it all the way around
2d	something 2d (2 dimensional) has only height and width – <b>two dimensions</b> : it is flat
foreground	the part of a view that is <b>closest to us</b> in a picture
background	the part of a view that is <b>furthest away</b> from us in a picture
middle ground	between the <b>foreground</b> and the <b>background</b>
foreshortening	where an object or a person is shown to be <b>bigger in the foreground</b> and <b>smaller in the background</b> to create an illusion of space
detail	a <b>small part</b> in a work of art which is <b>clearly shown</b> , e.g., a blade of grass
