Summer 1 focus

Our focus of this term is Animals and their babies. In this unit children will explore a wide range of different animals and will learn new vocabulary to name and describe animals and their offspring. This unit is a springboard for future learning in Reception when children study 'Growing and Changing' and look again at animals. Children will learn to say Kitten instead of baby cat so there will be a focus on vocabulary.

Phonics

Phonics

At Hazel Leys, we use the Little Wandle Letters and Sounds Revised scheme. In Nursery, your child will take part in daily phonics sessions which will encourage them to listen to sounds in words, such as the sound that their name starts with. This term we will focus on ck,e,u,r,h,b and playing listening attention games. Please speak to Nursery staff if you would like to start taking some phonics sounds home to practice with your children but please don't feel like you have too as it is optional.



Literacy – Writing

During this term we will be doing our pencil grip activities. Looking at pinch fingers and how we hold a pencil. We



Literacy - Reading

I will be uploading weekly what books we have been learning about in Nursery.

Every Friday, your child will choose a 'Reading for Pleasure' book to take home. This is a book to be shared with the adults at home. By reading a wide range of books, your child will be emersed in storytelling and it will help expand their vocabulary. Please bring the book in on a Thursday to be changed over and we will hand out a new book on a Friday.

We have reading groups every Friday. This is when the children can pick a book in key worker groups and have a discussion on the book to help children with their listening but to also develop their vocabulary.

will also be looking at mark making activities with different resources and materials. We will also begin to look at name writing for those children who are going up to reception.



Maths

We LOVE to count in Early Years, we count everything and sing lots of number rhymes to help us remember the order of numbers when rote counting. This term we will be focusing on accurate number recognition and will be looking at repeated patterns, asking the children to make their own patterns. We will also be looking at what number is bigger and what number is smaller.



Communication and Language

This term we will be focusing on many ways to help the children to develop their vocabulary. We begin with Phonics to help the children with their communication. We will also sing nursery rhymes daily and will send a nursery rhyme home each week for you to practice at home with your child. We will also be reading a mixtures of topic books and reading for pleasure books within the nursery.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

This term we will be looking at how to be a friend, why we come to nursery, being kind and sharing, telling an adult when there is a problem. Explaining my feelings to those of others. We will also be looking at school rules and how to form friendships within my class. We are really working on expressing our feelings and knowing the difference from right and wrong.



Physical Development

In Nursery, we will be practising ways to move, encouraging fine motor activities, such as using scissors, pencils, and cutlery, encouraging good posture when sitting at the table or on the floor and practicing ball skills. We also have dough disco every morning to strengthen our fine motor skills.

Our <u>PE lessons</u> will be on Tuesdays. This will be an opportunity for the children to go down to the track now the days are getting warmer.

Children are to come to nursery in clothes that allow them to move easily so they can take part in our PE sessions. E.G leggings/tracksuit and t-shirt.



Understanding the World

Children will learn that all animals have offspring (babies) but that not all animals look like their parents. They will compare a cat and a kitten before looking at a caterpillar and a butterfly to see a contrast. They will then study farm animals and will learn that some farm animals, such as lambs are born in springtime. Children will study the seasons again in Reception, offering another chance for them to secure their understanding. After learning about farm animals, children will move onto studying woodland animals such as badgers, foxes, owls, and hedgehogs.



Expressive Arts and Design

This term we will be doing a lot more junk modelling. Using cardboard boxes to make habitats and homes for the animals outdoors. Parents, if you have any spare boxes such as cereal boxes etc please feel free to bring them in for the children to junk model.

Skills Builder

The Skills Builder Universal Framework provides a common language for building essential skills with children and young people.

Research shows that building essential skills supports social and emotional wellbeing, learning and academic outcomes and careers and opportunities.



The children will receive 'Dojo Points' as reward for good behaviour, work and attitude. Points can be 'spent' on prizes periodically.

We will also be introducing a star of the week just in nursery class for your child to share at home with you.

Children earn Dojo points for tidying, being a good friend, working hard and completing all of their jobs. Every time a child hits 100, 200 and 300 etc they get to go to the prize cupboard for all their hard work.
